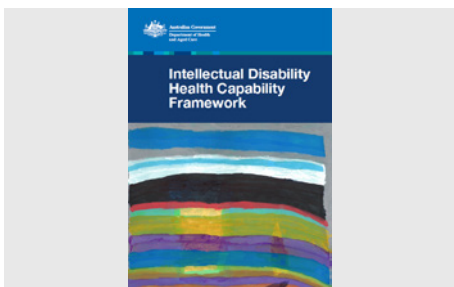




## Supporting the Intellectual Disability Health Capability Framework

- Tafe.

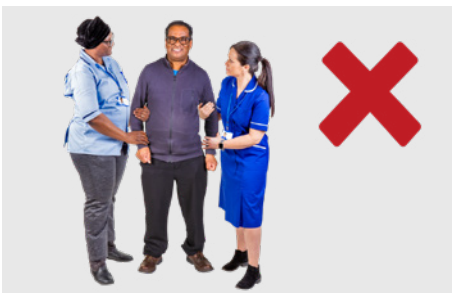
# Why are we doing this project

This will help people with intellectual disability get better health care.

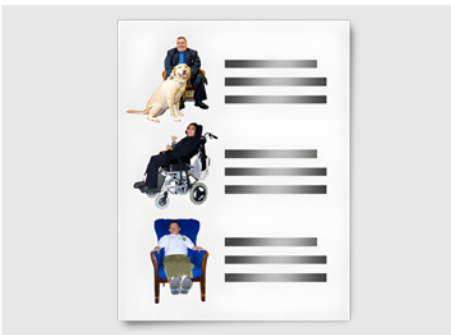
# What we are doing in the project



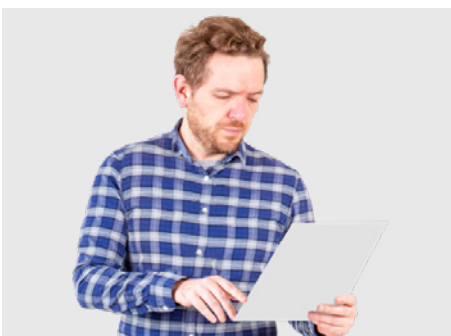
We are making information that will support people to use the framework.
